Created Winthrop Harmony Arts Garden to be an urban community theater/garden in Uptown and the artistic home of Green Scene Chicago. Envisioned and pitched the project idea to 48th Ward Alderman Osterman. Spearheaded the transformation of an abandoned lot into a space where seven families and four social service agencies grow food collectively and where Green Scene Chicago has presented eleven free performing arts events. Served as the foreperson for all aspects of the gardens development: artistic conception, grant writing, garden design and budget, soil testing, recruiting community partners and neighborhood gardeners, community assets mapping, collaboration with streets and sanitation, acquiring land protection and fiscal sponsorship from NeighborSpace, social media outreach, website advertising, press releases, recruiting and employing teenagers to garden and create theater with Green Scene Chicago, sourcing funding to pay teens, creating garden themed plays with teens and presenting them to public.

Green Scene Teen Summer Stock, Theater Director/Deviser, 2013 to present

Teach urban garden skills and theatrical devising to teenagers at Winthrop Harmony Arts Garden. Guide teen ensemble on how to grow plants and adapt garden-themed tales by using theatrical improvisation, movement and creative writing. Teens present the plays outdoors at Winthrop Harmony Arts Garden for local children grades K-8. Served over 800 audience members to date.
